SC rejects plea to quash probe against Ajit Pawar, others

SAYING THAT it is “not going to interfere with the High Court order”, the Supreme Court on Monday rejected a petition to quash the probe against NCP leader Ajit Pawar and others in connection with the Maharashtra State Cooperative Bank scam.

A bench of Justices Arun Mishra and MR Shah was hearing a plea challenging the August 22 Bombay High Court order asking the police to register an FIR against Pawar and others in connection with the scam which allegedly caused an estimated Rs 1,000 crore loss to the bank between 2007 and 2011. The court said the probe will proceed uninfluenced by any observation made by the High Court.

Acting on the HC direction, the Economic Offences Wing of the Mumbai Police had registered an FIR against Pawar and 70 former functionaries on charges of cheating and forgery.

Ajit Pawar and others had moved Supreme Court challenging the HC order. The petitioners contended that all of them were not heard by the HC but the court did not accept the argument.

The HC said that police had not filed an FIR despite an inspection report of the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development for the year 2009-10 and chargesheet filed by a quasi-judicial inquiry commission under the Maharashtra Cooperative Societies (MCS) Act showing “glaring irregularities”.

Odisha announces package for those affected by Puri eviction drive

Bhubaneswar: In view of the resentment among citizens over eviction around the Shri Jagannath Temple in Puri, Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik on Monday announced a rehabilitation and resettlement package for the affected people.

The administration had launched an eviction drive on August 19 to remove all the structures within a 75-metre radius of the temple to ensure safety and security of the 12th century structure.

The affected families will be given compensation for houses located in the cleared area. They will be provided with an immediate assistance of Rs 50,000 for transportation and allied expenses. A monthly assistance of Rs 10,000 towards rent will also be paid to the displaced families till they are provided with dwelling houses or land.

SC asks UP govt to form SIT, address grievances raised by law student

THE SUPREME COURT on Monday asked the Uttar Pradesh government to constitute a special investigation team (SIT) to “address the grievances” raised by the law student who had gone missing last month from her college in Shahjahanpur, alleging harassment by the college authorities. She was subsequently found in Rajasthan.

A bench of Justices R Banumathi and AS Bopanna ordered that the SIT will be headed by an officer of the rank of Inspector General of Police and assisted by an officer of Superintendent of Police rank.

BARRACKPORE MP INJURED IN CLASH

BJP MP led mob attack on police, says Bengal ADG

TOP OFFICIALS of West Bengal Police on Monday defended Barrackpore Police Commissioner Manoj Verma over Sunday's violence in Barrackpore, saying that he had done a “remarkable” job, and accused BJP MP Arjun Singh of leading a “planned attack” on the police.

The BJP MP from Barrackpore had sustained head injuries during a clash with police in Jagaddal area of the district on Sunday. Singh had accused Verma of “nearly assassinating” him by beating him with a baton. But the police had rejected the charge, saying that the BJP MP was “injured by bricks thrown by his supporters”.

Addressing a press conference at the State Secretariat on Monday, ADG (Law & Order) Gyanwant Singh said, “The protest cannot be spontaneous. It was planned. The way the police and Commissioner Manoj Verma were attacked, it shows it was planned... Verma himself was leading the force and the mob was being led by BJP MP Arjun Singh.”

“Instead of withdrawing the protest, the mob hurled bombs and pelted stones at the police team. Initially, the police tried to stay calm but later they used mild force to disperse the mob... Verma requested him (Singh) to pacify the mob... They assembled there with a certain motive, and it cannot be spontaneous. Police started chasing the mob. People kept throwing bricks and stones from rooftops targeting the Police Commissioner and his

It also asked the Chief Justice of Allahabad High Court to constitute a bench to monitor the investigation.

Suggestions invited for Bill to check assault on doctors

New Delhi: The Health Ministry has invited comments and suggestions within 30 days on the draft Healthcare Service Personnel and Clinical Establishments (Prohibition of violence and damage to property) Bill, which seeks to address the issue of doctors in hospitals being assaulted.

The Bill provides for a jail term of up to 10 years and a fine of up to Rs 10 lakh for such assaults. The provisions of the draft law are stringent — it categorises both mental and physical abuse as violence against doctors, and covers not just hospitals and a radius of 50 metres around them, but also home visits. Such violence, it says, will constitute an offence that is cognizable, non-bailable, non-compoundable and fit for trial by a court of the Judicial Magistrate of First Class.

to the college. “Tell them it's a Supreme Court direction,” Justice Banumathi observed.

The court also ordered that her stay in the short-stay home in New Delhi be continued until September 12.

Military Police: Training for 100 women likely to start in Dec

TAKING ANOTHER step towards induction of women as soldiers in Military Police, the Colonel Commandant of the Military Police, Lieutenant General Ashwani, interviewed Lieutenant Colonel Nandini in Srinagar on Monday over the “role of instructor of the first batch of women soldiers for the Army”, an Army statement said.

“First set of instructors is most important to us as it will lay down the foundation for generations to come,” Lt Gen Ashwani said, ac-

cording to the statement, and added that “there will be more women officers as instructors, including Maj Julie who was instructor to the first batch of women constables in Assam Rifles”.

It is the first time that the Army will recruit women as soldiers.

In the first batch, 100 women will be selected and trained and this is likely to start by December. Same as the training for men, it will last for 61 weeks, in the spirit that they are “soldiers first”, the Army statement said.

The strength of women in the Corps of Military Police will be increased by 100 every year,

till they reach a cadre strength of 1,700.

As Defence Minister in the previous term of the Narendra Modi government, Nirmala Sitharaman had cleared the decision to induct women into the Army in January this year.

But the current process is only restricted to Military Police, which, as per the Army's website, is mandated to “preserve good order and discipline and to prevent breaches of the same by persons serving in or attached to the regular Army”, provide “close protection” to the Army Chief and handle prisoners of war.

COUNSEL FOR MOSQUE SIDE

There was no massive structure, Hindu motifs at site, SC told

REJECTING THE Archeological Survey of India's report that there was a “massive structure” at the disputed site in Ayodhya and Hindu motifs inside the Babri Masjid, the counsel for the mosque side on Monday told the Supreme Court that there was no need to delve into distant history and what was relevant was who had the title to the site when the sovereignty of the area passed on to the British.

“There was no massive structure at the site and no Hindu motifs, just because there is a peacock or lotus does not mean they are Hindu,” Senior Advocate Rajeev Dhavan, appearing for the main appellant M Siddiq, told a five-judge Constitution bench headed by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi. The bench, also comprising Justices S A Bobde, D Y Chandrachud, Ashok Bhushan and SA Nazeer, is hearing appeals against the September 30, 2010 verdict of the Allahabad High court which ordered a three-way division of the disputed 2.77 acres.

Dhavan was referring to the arguments of the temple side that the recovery of lotus and peacock motifs discounted the claim that it was a mosque. “The Roman empire had every possible animal,” he said. Denying that there was a massive structure at the site, the counsel pointed to flaws in the methodology adopted by the ASI.

He also sought to contradict the claim that the presence of a well at the site reinforced the temple's case, saying “there were



no wells in the Vedic period”. Disputing the argument that a “parikrama route” around the structure could be considered as proof of a temple in the middle, Dhavan said, “Parikrama is only a form of worship, it is not a form of evidence”.

“The important question is with whom was the title of the place when the sovereignty of this part of the country passed on to the British,” the senior counsel said, adding there is proof that it was a mosque. He contended that as far as a civil suit was concerned, there was no question of relevance of historical facts, and if they were relied on, it would lead to erroneous conclusions.

Dhavan argued that the judgment of Justice Sudhir Agarwal of the Allahabad HC was based on “conjectures or preponderance of probability”.

Contending that Muslims were the aggrieved parties, Dhavan said, “In 1934, you break the mosque. In 1949, you commit trespass. Where in the law of relief will your lordships put these facts?... After all the demolition, you say that Hindu side must be protected... Where do we lose sense of this contemporary history which stares us in the face?”

JD(U) coins new slogan, RJD calls it defeatist

WITH ASSEMBLY elections in Bihar a little more than a year away, the JD(U) has come up with a new slogan — “*Kyun karen vichar, thihke to hai Nitish Kumar* (why should we consider others, Nitish Kumar is just fine)”.

The slogan — keeping the JD(U)'s national president and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar at the centre — has been displayed on hoarding with an image of a smiling and reflective Nitish.

During the 2015 Assembly elections, then JD(U) poll strategist and now the party's national vice-president Prashant Kishor had come up with the slogan “*Bihar me bahaar hai, Nitish Kumar hai* (Bihar is blooming because of Nitish Kumar)”.

While the JD(U) justified its new slogan saying there was a need for a catchline because of

organisational elections, the RJD called it “defeatist”.

Bihar BJP spokesperson Nikhil Anand said: “The NDA is a united force in Bihar. The poster is a message to the Grand Alliance, which is disunited and cannot say who its CM nominee is.”

Senior RJD leader and former minister Vijay Prakash took a dig at JD(U): “*Thihke* means ‘*kam-chalau*’ (just doable). JD(U) has accepted that Nitish is just okay. The slogan is defeatist.”

Senior JD(U) leader and minister Shyam Rajak, however, said: “We are simply saying that when everything is going so well under Nitish, what is the need to consider anyone else in 2020 elections?”

Garbage dump to Nature Park in two years: A Kullu success story

AN OPEN ground at Babeli village of Himachal Pradesh's Kullu district that used to be a drinking hole and garbage dump for villages around till two years ago, has been converted into a Nature Park, earning the Forest Department around Rs 15 lakh a year.

While a majority of the Rs 1.5 crore funds for the project came from the Forest Department, a crucial role was played by then Kullu Deputy Commissioner Rakesh Kanwar, who authorised Rs 40 lakh to develop the park. Kanwar, who is now Director, Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, was one of the recipients at The Indian Express Excellent in Governance Awards, winning in the category of 'Social Welfare'.

Kullu's Divisional Forest Officer Neeraj Chadha said it was the villagers who first approached them with the idea in 2015, inspired by a similar Nature Park in neighbouring Mohal village. Located 7 km from Kullu, on the banks of the



river Beas, at a height of 1,260 metres above sea level, the Babeli Nature Park was inaugurated on July 14, 2017, by then chief minister Virbhadra Singh.

Talking about how they turned the ground around,

Deputy Range Officer, Forest Department, Prashant Sharma, who has been associated with the project since the beginning, said, “We utilised the dumped beer bottles to make basements for seating platforms. The garbage was buried beneath the ground, and covered with soil brought from 5 km away.” Water flowing down from the hills was diverted to create a small channel that passes through the park, on which a pico (small) hydro system has been put up to explain power generation to visitors.

Sharma added, “Now we earn Rs 15 lakh a year just through ticket sales for entry, while spending around Rs 6 lakh on the park's upkeep, including salaries of eight workers and electricity charges. At the peak of the tourism season in May-June this year, we earned up to Rs 18,000 a day.”

Forty per cent of the money generated goes for development works in villages under Jindore and Nahlach panchayats that provided land for the park. The residents of these villages are also exempted from tickets for entry. A restaurant and boating

services are planned on a lake in the park next. Sharma said they expected Rs 5 lakh earnings annually from this.

Kanwar said the park had helped generate revenue, provide jobs, as well as served as a playing ground for children. Calling the award a “great recognition”, he added, “It will motivate young people to carry out innovative plans.”

Ganga Ram, 46, the pradhan of one of the 14 villages under the Jindore panchayat, remembers the time the ground was strewn with liquor bottles. “People would throw garbage here, use it to relieve themselves.”

Shashank Upadhyay, who runs a shop-cum-dhaba in front of the park, said their earnings have increased “significantly” since the park came up. He also welcomed the fact that a corner of the park had been designated as a cremation space, rather than people carrying out last rites all over the ground.

The administration is planning more parks now, including a second one in Manali and another near Rohtang Pass.

Want Unnao trial to be fair: SC

OBSERVATION Top court was hearing plea of one of the accused; CBI records rape survivor’s statement at AIIMS in accident case

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Monday said it expects the trial in all five cases related to Unnao gang rape to be “free and fair”.

A bench led by Justice Deepak Gupta made the remark while hearing an application filed by one of the accused in the 2017 gang rape case who has questioned the “fairness” of the top court order that fixed a 45-day deadline for a lower court to complete the trial in all cases.

Accused Shashi Singh has claimed that 45 days’ times is too less to complete the trial, and that his right to defend himself by cross-examining the witnesses will not be available to him.

The top court has sought a reply from the trial judge who was named to exclusively hear all the cases, and fixed September 6 to hear the matter again.

In a related development, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on Monday recorded the statement of the rape survivor in connection with a road accident case in July, in which she and her lawyer were seriously injured.

Two of the 19-year-old survivor’s relatives died in the accident; one of them was a witness in the rape case.

CBI officials said her statement was recorded only after the doctors at New Delhi’s All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), where the woman is undergoing treatment, confirmed that there was considerable improvement in her medical condition.

The woman has alleged that

Uttar Pradesh legislator Kuldeep Singh Sengar, who was expelled by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) last month, raped her in 2017 when she was a minor.

She and her lawyer met with an accident in Rae Bareilly on July 28. The rape survivor’s family has alleged Sengar orchestrated the attack from inside prison. Her mother claimed the accident was meant to “eliminate” her daughter.

A CBI official, requesting anonymity, confirmed recording the woman’s statement but refused to divulge the details. The Supreme Court has directed the agency to finish the probe in accident by September 6.

In its first information report (FIR) registered in the accident case, CBI has named suspended Sengar and his brother Manoj Singh Sengar, among others.

Meanwhile, the Delhi high

court issued notice to the lawyer representing the survivor as to why contempt proceedings should not be initiated against him for hindering the judicial proceedings by frequently interrupting during the hearing.

The court was hearing a petition by Uttar Pradesh constable Amir Khan, who is in judicial custody, seeking the quashing of framing of charges, including murder and criminal conspiracy, against him.

He has contended that an August 13 order was “illegal, improper, prejudicial and against established principles of criminal procedure code”.

Advocate Dharmendra Kumar Mishra, however, claimed that he did not do anything which could have invited contempt proceedings.

The court listed his plea for further hearing on September 5.

SIT probe ordered in law student case

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Monday ordered the Uttar Pradesh government to set-up an inspector general rank officer led Special Investigating Team (SIT) to probe the harassment allegations a student at a law college in Uttar Pradesh’s Shahjahanpur has levelled and to provide security to her family.

Former Union minister and Bharatiya Janata Party leader Swami Chinmayanand was booked for allegedly kidnapping the student after she posted a video on social media accusing “a big leader of the saint society” of threatening her and “destroying the lives of several girls”.

The student was traced to Rajasthan days after she went missing after posting the video on her Facebook page on August 24 and was produced before the apex court on August 30. Chinmayanand is chairman of the law college, where she studies.

A bench of Justices R Banumathi and AS Bopanna issued the direction regarding the SIT while underlining that it was not commenting on the merits of the allegation. It transferred the case to the Allahabad high court to monitor the police probe. The bench listed the issue related to shifting the student to another college under the Meerut University in Bareilly district, where her younger brother is pursuing law, for hearing on September 4.

The court ordered police protection for the student’s family after her parents expressed apprehensions about their safety. “We direct the Chief Secretary, of

UP, to direct the Superintendent of Police of Shahjahanpur, to afford protection to the parents and family members of the girl...,” the court said.

The court’s order came as it was hearing a group of woman lawyers, which had urged it to take suo motu cognisance of the case. The group said the student’s family feared for their safety because of the clout the college administration enjoys with the local authorities and police.

Additional solicitor general Vikramjit Banerjee, who appeared for UP, assured the state’s full cooperation.

The bench said it interacted with the student and her parents in-camera and added “she had certain grievances against the institution [where she was studying] and also against the management. We are not expressing any opinion... all that we are inclined to say is that correctness of grievance has to be addressed,” the bench said. It added the SIT shall look into that two cross FIRs registered in the matter and proceed.

During her interaction with the judges last week, she told them that she left Shahjahanpur along with her three college mates to protect herself.

Muslim parties begin their arguments in Ayodhya case

NEW DELHI: On the 17th day of hearing in the Ram Janmabhoomi-Babri Masjid land dispute case, the Muslim parties commenced their argument with senior advocate Rajeev Dhavan rejecting Archaeological Survey of India (ASI)’s finding that there was a massive structure at the site before the mosque took its place.

Dhavan told a five-judge bench led by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi that there was no need to delve into distant history. What was relevant was who had the title to the disputed site in Ayodhya when the “sovereignty was passed to the British.”

“There was no massive structure at the site and no Hindu motifs. Just because there is a peacock or lotus does not mean they are Hindu,” he submitted before a bench, which also comprising justices S A Bobde, D Y Chandrachud, Ashok Bhushan and S A Nazeer.

“Even the Roman empire had every possible animal,” Dhavan said, discounting the arguments advanced by the Hindu parties that the recovery of lotus and peacocks meant there was a temple at the site. He pointed to flaws in the methodology the ASI adopted to conclude that a massive structure stood there before the mosque. On the argument that a well at the site reinforced the presence of a temple, Dhavan said: “There were no wells in the Vedic period.” He even disputed the argument that the presence of a “parikrama route” around the structure was evidence to the presence of a temple.

du-Muslim issues were to be decided on the basis of evidence given by persons,” he cautioned. Historical facts would only lead to erroneous conclusions, he said. Justice Chandrachud pointed out that such an argument would also affect his case which was built on the “positive case” that the Babri Masjid was built during Babur’s time and the reference to inscriptions which were all based on history.

Meanwhile, the apex court also agreed to hear on Tuesday a contempt plea filed by Dhavan related to threats he said he received for taking up the matter. Dhavan, who appeared for lead petitioner M Siddiq and the All India Sunni Waqf Board, has said that he received a letter on August 14, 2019 from N Shanmugam, a retired education officer, threatening him for appearing for the Muslim parties.

CAN’T STOP PROBE AGAINST AJIT PAWAR IN MAHA BANK CASE: SC

The court refused to interfere with the Bombay high court’s direction for the police to register an FIR against Pawar and others. The bench observed that the case involves huge money and investigation cannot be stopped.

The agency has booked the company and alleged mastermind and managing director Mansoor Khan, besides 24 others and four sister concerns of the IMA, they said.

JODHPUR: A pilgrim was brutally beaten up by some villagers on the suspicion of child-lifting in Rajasthan’s Jodhpur district, police said on Monday. “A video of the villagers beating him up mercilessly went viral on social media. On the basis of it, we have identified four persons. A case has been registered against them,” said Phalodi SHO Rajeev Bhadu. The victim was identified as Shambhulal Garasia from Sirrohi district in Rajasthan. He was on his way to Ramdeora near Pokhran in Jaisalmer district to pay obeisance to local deity Baba Ramdeo.

22 held for murder of tea garden doctor

GUWAHATI: The police arrested 22 people on Monday, a day after a 73-year-old doctor succumbed to injuries inflicted by tea garden workers angry at the death of a colleague in Assam’s Jorhat.

“We have arrested 22 persons and sent them to judicial custody today [Monday]. They have been arrested on charges of murder, rioting, assault and provision of the Assam Medicare Services Persons Medicare Service Institutions (Prevention of Violence and Damage to Property) Act, 2011,” said NV Chandrakant, superintendent of police, Jorhat, adding that some more workers are being interrogated.

Chandrakant said more than half the arrested persons work at the Teok Tea Estate where the incident happened. “We have

(also) identified the seven to eight people who played a main role in the crime,” he added.

The incident is the latest in attacks against doctors across the country by irate patients or their friends and relatives. After countrywide protests by doctors in June, the government promised to draft a law on violence against doctors. A draft is ready, news agency PTI reported in mid-August, and could be presented before the Union Cabinet shortly.

“The garden doctor, Dr Deben Dutta was assaulted [on Saturday] following the death of one Somra Majhi who was undergoing treatment at the estate’s hospital,” Jorhat district deputy commissioner Roshni Aparanjy Korati had said on Sunday. Dr Dutta was taken to Jorhat Medical College and Hospital, where he died while undergoing treatment on Sunday, she had added.

Journalist among two booked for shooting ‘roti, salt’ video

VARANASI: The police on Sunday booked two people, including a journalist, for shooting and circulating a video of flatbread and salt being served to students at a government primary school at Shuir in Mirzapur district last month on charges that they conspired to defame the Uttar Pradesh government.

Mirzapur police superintendent Awadhesh Kumar Pandey said the two, Pawan Jaiswal and Rajkumar Pal, have been booked under sections 186 (voluntarily obstructing a public servant in discharge of his function), 193 (false evidence), 120 B (criminal conspiracy) and 420 (cheating). “The case was registered fol-

lowing a complaint by an education officer in the matter. The accused, Pal, has been taken into custody,” Pandey said.

Jaiswal is a journalist though it’s not known if he represented any mainstream media. He said, “I had informed additional basic shiksha adhikari when I went to shoot the video.” e posted a video on social media in which he has claimed that he was merely “discharging his duty as a journalist.”

The video went viral on social media on August 22 and prompted Mirzapur district mag-

istrate Anurag Patel to order a probe into the matter. The school’s headmaster, Radha Gupta, was suspended while two other officials were issued a notice. Patel said he also constituted a four-member committee to look into the matter after Uttar Pradesh chief minister Yogi Adityanath took a serious note of it. “On his instruction, a probe was conducted. The investigation revealed that the video was prepared and circulated deliberately,” said Patel. He added that the video appeared to have been prepared with a malicious intent.

Patel said Pal, who looked after the work under the midday meal scheme, called Jaiswal to the school on August 22 and, “under a conspiracy,” shot and shared the video on the social media.

Police trek 12 km to take injured Maoist to hospital

RAIPUR: A Chhattisgarh police team trekked 12 km through jungles to carry an injured Maoist commander to a hospital in Dantewada on Sunday, a police officer said on Monday. Madkam Hidma, who carried a bounty of Rs 5 lakh on his head, is now undergoing treatment for gangrene.

He developed gangrene after he was injured about a fortnight ago when he fell while laying an improvised explosive device (IED).

him to the district hospital,” said Dantewada’s police superintendent Abhishek Pallava.

He said a team of 35 constables had been dispatched to bring the Maoist commander from a village in the jungle where he was being treated. The team carried Hidma for 12 km crossing rivers and rough terrain. There were no other Maoist in the village.

“I instructed the force to bring the injured Maoist commander to hospital and did not waste time in interrogating him. Hidma developed gangrene and the infection could have been life-threatening,” said Pallava.

A member of the Maoists’ Malangir Area Committee, Hidma has over 10 cases registered against him for attacks on security forces in Sukma and Dantewada districts of Bastar region.

Pallava said that Hidma was injured in the forests near Nagarguda village in Sukma district. “He was being given faith healing and local treatment. Despite the swelling and blackening of limbs, he was not allowed to get allopathic

treatment,” Pallava said. Police had been tipped off about an injured man whom they later identified as Hidma.

Pallava said the police could consider recruiting Hidma.

“First, we treat all Maoists as citizens of the country and they have a right to medical treatment. If they have committed any crimes, courts will later try and punish them.

Secondly, it sends a positive signal to villagers that policemen are there to help them and thus boosts the perception of police and thirdly, Hidma can be an asset for future Naxal operations if he surrenders and joins the police force,” he said.

‘Don’t decide Ayodhya case on Hindus’ belief

Dhavan Opens Arguments For Muslim Parties

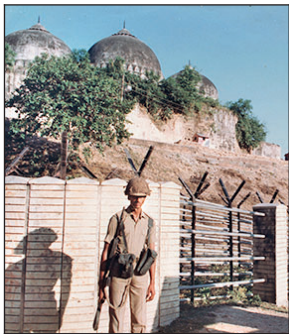

New Delhi: Contesting the claims of Hindu parties for ownership of the 2.77 acre disputed Ram Jannabhoomi-Babri Masjid land in Ayodhya, Muslim parties on Monday told the Supreme Court that the case could not be decided on the basis of Hindus’ belief and faith that Lord Ram was born at the disputed site by glossing over recorded historical facts since 1934 about a ‘living’ mosque.

For the Muslim parties, senior advocate Rajeev Dhavan said the SC’s decision in this case would have grave impact on the future of India, its secularism and the secular character of the Constitution. “What is to be determined and how in this case? How will the court determine the exact location of Lord Ram’s birthplace?” he asked.

Opening the arguments for Muslim parties on the 17th day of hearing before a bench of Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi and Justices S A Bobde, D Y Chandrachud, Ashok Bhushan and S Abdul Nazeer, the senior advocate faulted an observation from Justice Chandrachud that the court has to do a balancing act while hearing this case.

Asserting that Muslims were rightful owners of the disputed site, Dhavan said, “The entire secular structure

of this country will crumble if we do a balancing act in this case, as was said by Justice Chandrachud. There are no Hindu motifs in Babri Masjid. Just because a peacock or a lotus picture was found on some slab, does it mean it was a Hindu structure?”

“In 1934, Hindus damaged the masjid. In 1949, they trespassed into the masjid and placed idols inside it. In 1992, the Hindus demolished it. Where do these facts stand for consideration before the Supreme Court? Do we lose sight of contemporary historical facts and travel into faith and belief to decide this case? And Hindus say their rights are to be protected. Is it a Hindu Constitution that their rights would be protected despite all these historical facts stacked against their claim?”

When the bench said there was no need to go into Hindu Constitution as it was a secular Constitution, Dhavan said it was important to discern certain things from the manner in

SC to hear Dhavan’s contempt plea

Acceding to senior advocate Kapil Sibal’s request, the five-judge bench headed by CJI Ranjan Gogoi on Monday agreed to hear Rajeev Dhavan’s application seeking initiation of contempt proceedings against an 88-year-old man for allegedly cursing him with physical disabilities for appearing for Muslim parties against deity Ram Lala.

Sibal said Dhavan had been receiving threats for appearing for Muslims on and off but the letter by the 88-year-old from Chennai took the cake. “By sending the letter, the alleged contemnor has committed criminal contempt because he is intimidating a senior advocate who is appearing for a party/parties before the SC and discharging his duties as a senior advocate,” he added.

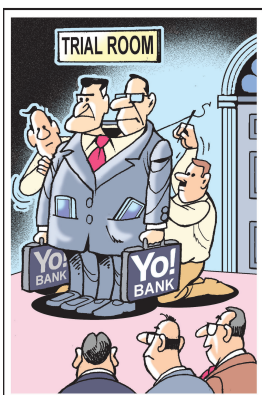

Tax filings may increase 10% by March-end: Govt

New Delhi: The government is hoping for a 10% jump in tax returns filed by the end of March as many individuals who did not make their annual filings by the August 31 deadline may do so by paying a penalty.

Data released by the income tax department on Sunday showed that returns filed up to August had increased by 4% to 5.65 crore but was largely limited to salaried individuals. Going forward, those who file their returns by December will have to pay a penalty of Rs 5,000 while a penalty of Rs 10,000 will be levied on those filing by March 31. In the coming months, several other categories have to file their annual returns.

Last year, there was a 71% jump in the number of returns filed up to August 31. The number of returns filed for financial year 2017-18 rose 26% up to March 31 as the government managed to add nearly 1 crore new filers, taking the number to 6.84 crore. Officials said the surge last year was on account of demonetisation as well as the initial impact of goods and services tax, which was rolled out on July 1, 2017, prompting many to disclose their income which was suppressed earlier.

Tax officials said the growth this year was achieved on the back of a steady rise over the last two-three years.

Besides, they believe that the robustness of the Aadhaar system has also been proved during the current exercise as nearly 80% of the over 3 crore returns that have been verified were done using the unique identification number as people opted to do away with sending returns by courier.

The government finds the increasing use of Aadhaar as an ID in the I-T returns process encouraging along with the broad acceptance of pre-filled forms with details such as salary, income from FDs and mutual funds and TDS picked from an assessee’s PAN card details.
